The NB Provincial Music Festival to be held June 1-4 in Sackville, NB

The NB Provincial Music Festival will be held in Sackville, June 1-4, 2016. The four-day competitive festival will feature approximately 100 young musicians from around the province who have been recommended as their local festival representatives by the adjudicators at those festivals.

The NB Federation of Music Festivals, the umbrella organization for the 15 local festivals around the province, sponsors the NB Provincial Music Festival. The Provincial Music Festival is under the direction of the Executive Director, Barbara Long, of Hartland and an executive committee with representatives from various local festivals around the province. The Marjorie Young Bell Conservatory, Mount Allison University will be used as venues for three levels of competition.

The adjudicators for this prestigious event are specialists in their field.

A session announcing the winners follows at the end of each day. Each first place winner receives a cash award. The adjudicators will also announce those senior competitors who are being recommended to represent New Brunswick at the National Music Festival at MacEwan University in Edmonton, Alberta, August 11-13.
